

He eventually transitioned to digital cameras and processing to develop his stylized landscape, still life, architecture and abstract photographs.

Steve uses creative techniques and processes to make his images. An example is Central Park's "The Bow Bridge", included in this exhibit - which is truly iconic for its archer's bow shape and cast-iron construction. To make this image, he blended several black and white photographs and used a pen and tablet to create a unique view of the bridge, which is one of the most visited locations in the Park.

Steve has written articles for magazines, had his work shown on the Showtime Network, and provides individualized photography training. His book, "New York Light & Shadow" sold out in bookstores, galleries that represent his work, and online. He is a member of the Association of Media Photographers (ASMP), The Leica Society, and the East End Photographers Group (EEPG).
